Recently the Session has heard several reports about repairs, deferred maintenance, and other upgrades which our current facilities will require. The cost of this work has been found to be most likely well more than \$100,000. This is not an issue of finances but wanting to make best use of our facilities. Before the session spends that kind of money, the session would like some idea of what our exact physical facilities needs are and how we can most effectively meet those needs. Decisions on these matters will have definite long-term impacts which will need to be a part of any decisions made.

Planning to make best use of all of our facilities is a subject on which many people may have an interest or may have some specific knowledge that would be of use in making these decisions. At its meeting last Tuesday, The session voted to set up a task force to explore these issues and is seeking the participation of anyone who believes they have a particular interest in this area.

The Session does not believe that this task force will be a particularly long-term one nor should it be excessively time-consumptive. We are hoping for members with expertise or interest in both the preschool and the church. If this is an issue on which you would like to help with, please let Gaylord Jones know. The Session is hoping to appoint the Task Force members at our meeting in late May.

Pastor Tom will begin a new Bible Study on The Gospel of John beginning June 6th. It will be held in the Giffey Room at 10:30 a.m. every Thursday this summer.

All three synoptic Gospels get a liturgical year in the lectionary calendar (we are currently in Year B with a focus on Mark). John does not but readings from John are peppered in throughout the three year cycle. This allows us to hear John's voice but we really don't have an opportunity to look at John's message from beginning to end.

John also uses language that is sometimes problematic (something brought out well in our just past book study).

It has also been a Gospel used by fundamentalists to make Jesus' message fairly exclusive.

- •Was that John's intent?
- •Who was his original audience?
- •Why did he write his Gospel?
- Why does it differ in sequence and focus from the other three?

We will examine these questions and more. Come for a lively discussion.

Pastor Tom Paine opened the meeting with prayer at 5:15 with a quorum present. The guests were acknowledged and given the privilege of the floor.

Devotions Carol Days

PNC Report

J Vander Stoep

J gave a short report of the PNC committee. It has been working for two years and have looked at 160 applicants. Eight to ten people have had second interviews and three have been invited to visit Chehalis. The church is working with a Presbyterian matching system that doesn't work very well. All churches using it are struggling. We had a liaison, Shari Jackson Martin. We raised the salary we are offering and that didn't seem to make a difference. One of the big hurdles for pastors is housing. PNC wondered if WPC should go back to having a manse?

This firm will make two visits to Chehalis. The first will be to meet with the PNC and church members to have us home in on the four main qualities we want. They will look for people with the four qualities we give them around the country, and they will ask if they would come to Washington. They check official references and secondary ones. Then, probably about two months, they come back to the PNC with 5 to 7 candidates all of whom they know would at least really consider this position. The PNC can have zoom interviews with each to start evaluating the candidates.

PneuMatrix sent a 20 page plus proposal for developing a pool of candidates for a pastoral search.

The PNC requests that we try using a PneuMatrix to assist us in our search for the called pastor. The charge for this company is \$10,000. They will work with us until a pastor is found. It was MSP to approve the hiring of PneuMatrix to assist us in hiring a new called pastor. The funds will come from with Children/Youth Fund or Living Tribute.

Pastor's Report

Rev. Tom Paine

Meetings and Activities:

- a. Worship: Easter has gone quite well. I am pleased with our super music program and find everyone upbeat in worship. I also want you to know I have pulpit supply for the 2nd and 5th Sundays filled in through August. I am working on items in our sanctuary including sound, banners, and developing a greeting system. Elders abound helping with all of that.:)
- b. Classes: I am enjoying the discussion around Don Wilson's book choice *The Difficult Words* of *Jesus* by Amy-Jill Levine. It is possible that I could offer a class the summer if no one else is.
- c. Mission: Are we on hold with One Parish / One Prisoner? Can we include a tiny house update in worship?
 - Don Wilson will speak to the congregation on May 5th asking anyone interested to contact Pastor Tom. If this mission is to continue, we need 5 to 7 participants.
- d. Session: I have been able to meet with Jan Stites so far. I am hoping to do so with each of you in the coming months as we develop each of your focus areas. I really want us to make use of the announcements more effectively and our communication tools (Weekly Witness, signage, social media).
- e. Pastoral Care: I am continuing to work with members of the congregation on pastoral issues. I was able to deliver home communion right after Easter. I am focused on getting our Deacons back in action too.
- f. Presbytery: Co-moderating and being a liaison to churches on the Commission for Ministry continues to keep me busy. We have had four online meetings so far and an in-person one coming up next month.
- g. Deacons: The deacons have not met since Wayne resigned. I want to call a Deacons meeting the next Sunday Wayne is in town as a new leader is chosen.
- h. Office: I will be working with Linda and Carol with the Directory. I also will be working with Robert on the banners. I will be working with Keith and Michael to continue to fine tune our presentation online.
- Pastor Tom Paine took part in the marriage ceremony of Josh and Caitlyn Woodson on April 11, 2024.
- j. Pastor Tom Paine did a funeral service for William Wirtanew on April 25, 2024.
 Plans:
- If indeed the path to getting an installed pastor is a longer one, I hope to act more as your transitional pastor than bridge pastor.
- I am working on a summer sermon series on the prophets.
- 3. I am excited to help get a new process in place to welcome our visitors.
- I am traveling Thursday and Friday to help move my daughter from WSU. She starts OSU
 online in the summer.
- I plan to propose at the next Building and Grounds meeting the church investigating getting door alarms put on the church building. I also, as mentioned above, want them to investigate signage.
- The docket for the Session meetings will have a deadline of the one week before the Session meeting to be included on the docket. Pastor Tom will talk with Linda Capps, secretary about this deadline.

Treasurer's Report

Balance Sheet Items

During March, the General Fund ran a surplus of \$16,925.05. Annual giving payments and a lack of any quarterly expenses contributed to the size of the surplus. For the year, we are running a surplus of \$13.548.89.

We have used all our water bill rebate we received last year. That item has now dropped off the spreadsheet.

A new liability, Preschool Prepaid Tuition, has shown up within the Preschool portion of the balance sheet. We had an individual, who for personal reasons, paid their entire school year 2024-2025 tuition in March. For accounting purposes, this should not be shown as income in March, but rather as a liability to be liquidated as we earn that income. That will begin with the student's participation next school year. Their making this prepayment also increased our cash assets.

Notes for Income

Pledges/Regular Giving for March was \$31,318.03. This is more than our usual average amount for a month, but there was an annual gift included in that amount.

Total contributions of \$1,150 were received for several of our special offerings.

Temporary Restricted Fund Activities

There was no activity in the Investment in Youth Fund during March. The overall balance in the Investment in Youth Fund remains \$74,824.32.

Notes for Expenses

Our natural gas bill was considerably higher than our average bill. The bill covers our heating for the cold month of February. We pay the bill the month after the gas is provided.

March, being a five-Sunday month, had us using two pulpit supplies during the month. Thus, the amount spent is higher than usual.

Capital Improvement Fund (CIF)

The only activity in the CIF was our regular quarterly savings interest payment. For the CIF, that was \$18.93. Including the Rug Replacement Account, the CIF has a total of \$136,649.13.

Preschool

In March, the Preschool had a deficit of \$406.45. This does not include the tuition prepayment described above. For the 2023-2024 school year, the Preschool still has a healthy surplus of \$6,682.32. We also have a surplus of \$200 for the next school year. The deficit for this month was mostly attributable to increased supply expenses, which used the funds received in February from their annual fundraiser.

Other Items

The new printer is installed! It was installed on April 25th, so allowing a few days for the billing process to work, I suspect the payments for it will show up in our May financials. As agreed by the Session, it will be paid out of the existing copier lease account, with the remainder coming out of the Loving Tribute reserve account.

At the end of March, we had \$92,677.61 in the church's regular checking account. This is far more than we really need to have in this non-interest-bearing account. I will be drafting a proposal to be considered by the Session to give me permission to transfer some of these funds to an interest-bearing savings account, and to return them when needed. This proposal will be sent in a separate document.

In order to ensure that adequate funds are available in the church's regular checking account and ensure that funds in excess of that amount generate interest for the church, the Treasurer is authorized to transfer funds from our regular savings account to the regular checking account when needed to cover our obligations, and transfer funds from our regular checking account to our regular savings account when the balance of the regular checking account is greater than that required to meet our obligations. All transfers made in this fashion shall be reported to the Session at its next meeting. It was MSP to give permission to Treasurer, Guy Warren, to make transfers as necessary.

History Corner #16 May 2024 History of the Art Wall

In 1976, for the first time in 25 years, our church had a Bazaar. The previous Bazaar in 1951 helped pay for the Education Wing. Now this brick addition to our church was being repainted and the final improvements would be on display at a celebration. Jean Smith and Kaye Kaufman co-chaired this event along with the five circles active in the church: Martha, Alice Miles. Elizabeth Currey, Westerians and Morningtide. This was before Louise Guthner was formed. The event consisted of crafts, games for the children and baked goods for sale in the Country Store, a luncheon and supper. Another purpose of the Bazaar was to carpet the Sanctuary during this improvement project.

Kaye was chairperson for the Art Wall. She featured the work of Rosco Doane, noted Chehalis artist, given by his wife. Also hung along the wall were paintings by local church artists for sale to benefit the Bazaar. The public could walk the halls and make

their choices to buy or just enjoy the local art work.

Some of these paintings did not sell and they hung there over the years. In 2009 when Mel and Jean Bluhm and daughter Sheri Davis redid the "Giffey Room", they decided to again feature the Art Wall in the Church. Picture shows panel walls, books on shelves and overflow of the crowd from the 150 Anniversary supper in the Giffey Room. Hanging outside the History



Room are interesting creative paintings by members or former members of our congregation for everyone to enjoy. The wall it big enough so if current members wish to
